PROCEEDINGS UNDER THE LOUISIANA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT LA. R.S. 30:2001, ET SEQ.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The following Settlement Agreement is hereby agreed to between House of Raeford Farms of Louisiana, L.L.C. ("Respondent") and the Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ" or "the Department"), under authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act, La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq. ("the Act").

I

Respondent is a limited liability company that owns and/or operates a poultry processing plant located in Arcadia, Bienville Parish, Louisiana ("the Facility").

II

On August 30, 2006, the Department issued to Respondent a Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-06-0225 (Exhibit 1).

On February 15, 2008, the Department issued to Respondent an Amended Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-06-0225A (Exhibit 2).

On August 19, 2009, the Department issued to Respondent an Amended Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-06-0225B (Exhibit 3).

On February 22, 2012, the Department issued to Respondent a Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-11-01515 (Exhibit 4).

On December 17, 2013, the Department issued to Respondent an Amended Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-11-01515A (Exhibit 5).

On November 26, 2013, the Department issued to Respondent a Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-13-00771 (Exhibit 6).

On May 22, 2014, the Department issued to Respondent an Amended Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-13-00771A (Exhibit 7).

On November 14, 2014, the Department issued to Respondent an Amended Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-13-00771B (Exhibit 8).

On May 26, 2015, the Department issued to Respondent an Amended Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement Tracking No. WE-CN-13-00771C (Exhibit 9).

Respondent denies it committed any violations or that it is liable for any fines, forfeitures and/or penalties.

IV

Nonetheless, Respondent, without making any admission of liability under state or federal statute or regulation, agrees to pay, and the Department agrees to accept, a payment in the amount of FORTY-THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$40,000.00), of which Four Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Six and 87/100 Dollars (\$4,566.87) represents the Department's enforcement costs, in settlement of the claims set forth in this Settlement Agreement. The total amount of money expended by Respondent on cash payments to the Department as described above, shall be considered a civil penalty for tax purposes, as required by La. R.S. 30:2050.7(E)(1).

V

Respondent further agrees that the Department may consider the inspection report(s), permit record(s), the Consolidated Compliance Orders & Notices of Potential Penalty, Amended Consolidated Compliance Orders & Notices of Potential Penalty and this Settlement Agreement for the purpose of determining compliance history in connection with any future enforcement or permitting action by the Department against Respondent, and in any such action Respondent shall be estopped from objecting to the above-referenced documents being considered as proving the violations alleged herein for the sole purpose of determining Respondent's compliance history.

VI

This Settlement Agreement shall be considered a final order of the Secretary for all purposes, including, but not limited to, enforcement under La. R.S. 30:2025(G)(2), and Respondent hereby waives any right to administrative or judicial review of the terms of this agreement, except such

review as may be required for interpretation of this Settlement Agreement in any action by the Department to enforce this Settlement Agreement.

VII

This Settlement Agreement is being made in the interest of settling the state's claims and avoiding for both parties the expense and effort involved in litigation or an adjudicatory hearing. In agreeing to the compromise and Settlement Agreement, the Department considered the factors for issuing civil penalties set forth in La. R. S. 30:2025(E) of the Act.

VIII

As required by law, the Department has submitted this Settlement Agreement to the Louisiana Attorney General for approval or rejection. The Attorney General's concurrence is appended to this Settlement Agreement.

IΧ

The Respondent has caused a public notice advertisement to be placed in the official journal of the parish governing authority in Bienville Parish, Louisiana. The advertisement, in form and wording approved by the Department, announced the availability of this Settlement Agreement for public view and comment and the opportunity for a public hearing. Respondent has submitted an original proof-of-publication affidavit and an original public notice to the Department and, as of the date this Settlement Agreement is executed on behalf of the Department, more than forty-five (45) days have elapsed since publication of the notice.

X

Payment is to be made within thirty (30) days from notice of the Secretary's signature. If payment is not received within that time, this Settlement Agreement is voidable at the option of the Department. Payments are to be made by check, payable to the Department of Environmental

Quality, and mailed or delivered to the attention of Accountant Administrator, Financial Services Division, Department of Environmental Quality, Post Office Box 4303, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70821-4303. Each payment shall be accompanied by a completed Settlement Payment Form attached hereto.

ΧI

In consideration of the above, any claims for penalties are hereby compromised and settled in accordance with the terms of this Settlement Agreement.

XII

Each undersigned representative of the parties certifies that he or she is fully authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of his or her respective party, and to legally bind such party to its terms and conditions.



CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY

The following CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY is issued to HOUSE OF RAEFORD FARMS OF LOUISIANA, L.L.C. (RESPONDENT) by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (the Department), under the authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act (the Act), La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq., and particularly by La. R.S. 30:2025(C), 30:2050.2 and 30:2050.3(B).

FINDINGS OF FACT

I.

The Respondent owns and/or operates a poultry processing plant located at 3867 Second St. in Arcadia, Bienville Parish, Louisiana. The Respondent is authorized to discharge certain qualities and quantities of wastewater into an unnamed ditch, thence into an unnamed tributary

of Brinson Creek, thence into Brinson Creek, thence into Black Lake Creek, all waters of the state, under authority of Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit LA0002844, which became effective on September 1, 2004, and which expires on August 31, 2009.

II.

The Respondent was issued AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER WE-C-04-1065A on or about February 24, 2006 for violations of LPDES permit LA0002844 effluent limitations and for an unauthorized discharge into waters of the state. The Order required the Respondent to immediately take any and all steps to meet and maintain compliance with LPDES permit LA0002844 and to submit a written report to include the circumstances of the cited violations. The Respondent submitted a written response on or about March 15, 2006. AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER WE-C-04-1065A is a final action of the Department and not subject to further review.

III.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about May 2, 2006, revealed that the Respondent failed to collect representative samples as required in LPDES permit LA0002844. Specifically, the Respondent's LPDES permit requires that CBOD, TSS, and Ammonia samples at outfall 001 be collected as a 6-hour composite-flow proportioned sample. Although the Respondent was collecting the samples as a 6-hour composite; the samples were not being composited proportioned to flow. The failure to collect representatives samples is in violation of AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER WE-C-04-1065A, LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I, Part II, Section F, and Part III, Sections A.2 and C.2), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(1)(b), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.2701.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.J.1.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about May 2, 2006, and a subsequent file review conducted on or about July 12, 2006, revealed the following effluent violations, as reported by the Respondent on Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs):

Each effluent excursion is in violation of AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER WE-C-04-1065A, LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I, and Part III, Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(1)(b), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.501.D, and LAC 33:IX.2701.A.

IV.

Further file review conducted by the Department revealed that the Respondent's percent coefficient of variation was 223.6% for Retest #1 of the Toxicity Tests conducted in April 2006. LPDES permit LA0002844 requires the percent coefficient of variation between replicates to be 40% or less. This is in violation of AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER WE-C-04-1065A, LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I, Part II, Section L.2.a.vi, and Part III, Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(1)(b), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.501.D, and LAC 33:IX.2701.A.

V.

In October 2005, the Respondent began a bioaugmentation project at their anaerobic lagoon in order to reduce the amount of solids that have accumulated in the lagoon. The Respondent also installed two-40 horse power blowers in the aerated lagoon and are operating them on a 24-hour/7-day basis in order to facilitate the removal of ammonia and reduce the CBOD concentration.

COMPLIANCE ORDER

Based on the foregoing, the Respondent is hereby ordered:

I.

To immediately take, upon receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, any and all steps necessary to meet and maintain compliance with LPDES permit LA0002844.

II.

To comply with the following schedule:

October 2005 Began Bioaugmentation Project

May 2007 Complete Bioaugmentation Project

July 2007 Facility Fully Operational and Achieving Final Effluent Limits

The Respondent shall submit monthly progress reports to the Department commencing on October 1, 2006, concerning the above-referenced project. The first report shall include a summary of the project since commencement of the activities to date.

III.

To submit to the Enforcement Division, within thirty (30) days after receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, a written report that includes a detailed description of the

circumstances surrounding the cited violations and actions taken or to be taken to achieve compliance with the Order Portion of this COMPLIANCE ORDER. This report and all other reports or information required to be submitted to the Enforcement Division by this COMPLIANCE ORDER shall be submitted to:

THE RESPONDENT SHALL FURTHER BE ON NOTICE THAT:

I.

The Respondent has a right to an adjudicatory hearing on a disputed issue of material fact or of law arising from this COMPLIANCE ORDER. This right may be exercised by filing a written request with the Secretary no later than thirty (30) days after receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER.

II.

The request for an adjudicatory hearing shall specify the provisions of the COMPLIANCE ORDER on which the hearing is requested and shall briefly describe the basis for the request. This request should reference the Enforcement Tracking Number and Agency Interest Number, which are located in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of this document and should be directed to the following:

III.

Upon the Respondent's timely filing a request for a hearing, a hearing on the disputed issue of material fact or of law regarding this COMPLIANCE ORDER may be scheduled by the Secretary of the Department. The hearing shall be governed by the Act, the Administrative Procedure Act (La. R.S. 49:950, et seq.), and the Department's Rules of Procedure. The Department may amend or supplement this COMPLIANCE ORDER prior to the hearing, after providing sufficient notice and an opportunity for the preparation of a defense for the hearing.

IV.

This COMPLIANCE ORDER shall become a final enforcement action unless the request for hearing is timely filed. Failure to timely request a hearing constitutes a waiver of the Respondent's right to a hearing on a disputed issue of material fact or of law under Section 2050.4 of the Act for the violation(s) described herein.

٧.

The Respondent's failure to request a hearing or to file an appeal or the Respondent's withdrawal of a request for hearing on this COMPLIANCE ORDER shall not preclude the Respondent from contesting the findings of facts in any subsequent penalty action addressing the same violation(s), although the Respondent is estopped from objecting to this COMPLIANCE ORDER becoming a permanent part of its compliance history.

VI.

Civil penalties of not more than twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$27,500) for each day of violation for the violation(s) described herein may be assessed. For violations which occurred on August 15, 2004, or after, civil penalties of not more that thirty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$32,500) may be assessed for each day of violation. The Respondent's

failure or refusal to comply with this **COMPLIANCE ORDER** and the provisions herein will subject the Respondent to possible enforcement procedures under La. R.S. 30:2025, which could result in the assessment of a civil penalty in an amount of not more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for each day of continued violation or noncompliance.

VII.

For each violation described herein, the Department reserves the right to seek civil penalties in any manner allowed by law, and nothing herein shall be construed to preclude the right to seek such penalties.

NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY

I.

Pursuant to La. R.S. 30:2050.3(B), you are hereby notified that the issuance of a penalty assessment is being considered for the violation(s) described herein. Written comments may be filed regarding the violation(s) and the contemplated penalty. If you elect to submit comments, it is requested that they be submitted within ten (10) days of receipt of this notice.

И.

Prior to the issuance of additional appropriate enforcement action(s), you may request a meeting with the Department to present any mitigating circumstances concerning the violation(s). If you would like to have such a meeting, please contact Wayne R. Slater at (225) 219-3778 within ten (10) days of receipt of this NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY.

III.

The Department is required by La. R.S. 30:2025(E)(3)(a) to consider the gross revenues of the Respondent and the monetary benefits of noncompliance to determine whether a penalty

will be assessed and the amount of such penalty. Please forward the Respondent's most current annual gross revenue statement along with a statement of the monetary benefits of noncompliance for the cited violation(s) to the above named contact person within ten (10) days of receipt of this NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY. Include with your statement of monetary benefits the method(s) you utilized to arrive at the sum. If you assert that no monetary benefits have been gained, you are to fully justify that statement.

IV.

This CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY is effective upon receipt.

The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (the Department) hereby amends the CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY issued to HOUSE OF RAEFORD FARMS OF LOUISIANA, L.L.C. (RESPONDENT) on August 30, 2006, in the above-captioned matter as follows:

I.

The Department hereby amends paragraph III on page 3 of the Findings of Fact to read as follows:

Inspections conducted by the Department on or about May 2, 2006, and June 27, 2007, and a subsequent file review conducted on or about January 17, 2008, revealed the following effluent violations, as reported by the Respondent on Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs):

III.

The Department hereby inserts the following paragraph into the Findings of Fact:

"VII.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about June 27, 2007, revealed that the Respondent failed to properly operate and maintain all facilities and systems of treatment and control which are installed or used to achieve compliance with LPDES permit LA0002844. Specifically, several diffusers were inoperable in the aeration basin, and the skimmer pump in the clarifier was not operating properly. The Respondent submitted correspondence dated August 10, 2007, indicating that they were aware of the diffuser problem and have been replacing the ten diffuser headers since September 2006. Two remaining headers were scheduled to be replaced. The failure to operate and maintain all facilities and systems of treatment and control is in violation of AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER WE-C-04-1065A, LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part III, Section A.2 and B.3.a), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(1)(b), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.501.D, and LAC 33:IX.2701.A and E."

IV.

The Department incorporates all of the remainder of the original CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY, ENFORCEMENT TRACKING NO. WE-CN-06-0225 and AGENCY INTEREST NO. 25163 as if reiterated herein.

V.

This AMENDED CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY is effective upon receipt.

The Respondent owns and/or operates a poultry processing plant located at 3867 Second St. in Arcadia, Bienville Parish, Louisiana. The Respondent is authorized to discharge certain qualities and quantities of wastewater into an unnamed ditch, thence into an unnamed tributary of Brinson Creek, thence into Brinson Creek, thence into Black Lake Creek, all waters of the state, under authority of Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit LA0002844, which became effective on September 1, 2004, and which expires on August 31, 2009. The Respondent submitted an application for the renewal of LPDES permit LA0002844

on or about January 30, 2009. The Department determined that the application was administratively complete on or about February 5, 2009; therefore, LPDES permit LA0002844 will be continued past the expiration date until LPDES permit LA0002844 is reissued by the Department or until Respondent is otherwise notified in writing by the Department."

The following CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY is issued to HOUSE OF RAEFORD FARMS OF LOUISIANA, L.L.C. (RESPONDENT) by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (the Department), under the authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act (the Act), La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq., and particularly by La. R.S. 30:2025(C), 30:2050.2 and 30:2050.3(B).

FINDINGS OF FACT

I.

The Respondent owns and/or operates a poultry processing plant located at 3867 Second St. in Arcadia, Bienville Parish, Louisiana. The Respondent is authorized to discharge certain qualities and quantities of wastewater into local drainage, thence into an unnamed tributary of Brinson Creek, thence into Brinson Creek, thence into Black Lake Creek, all waters of the state, under authority of Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit LA0002844, which became effective on August 1, 2010, and which expires on July 31, 2015. Previously, the Respondent was authorized to discharge into waters of the state under LPDES permit LA0002844, which became effective on September 1, 2004, and which expired on August 31, 2009. The Respondent did submit a renewal

application on or about January 16, 2009; therefore, LPDES permit LA0002844 was administratively continued.

II.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about May 18, 2010, revealed the following violations:

- A. The Respondent failed to have a certified thermometer in a refrigerator that contained samples used for compliance monitoring,
- B. The Respondent failed to maintain a calibration log for the pH meter used for compliance monitoring,
- C. The Respondent failed to record the time on the laboratory chain of custody that Fecal Coliform samples were collected that are used for compliance monitoring, and
- D. The Respondent failed to submit the fourth quarter 2009 Biomonitoring DMR in a timely manner.

The violations listed in A-B above, are in violation of LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part III, Sections A.2 and C.5), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.2701.E. The violation listed in C above, is in violation of LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I and Part III, Sections A.2 and D.4), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.2701.J.3. The violation listed in D above, is in violation of LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I and Part III, Sections A.2 and D.4), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.2701.L.4.d. On or about August 10, 2010, the Respondent did inform the Department that a certified thermometer was subsequently installed in the sample refrigerator; that the pH calibration records are now recorded on the Daily Wastewater Check Form and retained for seven (7) years; and that the times that the Fecal Coliform samples are taken are now being noted on the chain of custody.

III.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about September, 28, 2011, and a subsequent file review conducted on or about January 5, 2012, revealed the following violations for effluent exceedances as reported by the Respondent on Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs):

Each effluent exceedance is in violation of LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I, and Part III, Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, and LAC 33:IX.501.D.

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Further inspection conducted by the Department on or about September 28, 2011, revealed that the Respondent failed to collect representative samples as required in LPDES permit LA0002844. Specifically, the Respondent's LPDES permit requires that Whole Effluent Toxicity (WET) 24-hour composite samples at outfall 001 to be collected in proportion to flow. The Respondent was collecting the WET samples as six (6) grab samples over a 24-hour period that are not combined in proportion to flow. The failure to collect representative samples is in violation of LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I, Part II, Section F, and Part III, Sections A.2 and C.2), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.J.1.

V.

The file review conducted by the Department on or about January 5, 2012, also revealed that the Respondent failed to submit a complete and accurate DMR. Specifically, the DMR for December 2010, did not report the result for Fecal Coliform at outfall 001A. The failure to submit a complete and accurate DMR is in violation of LPDES permit LA0002844 (Part I, Part II, Section F, and Part III, Sections A.2 and C.2), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.L.4.d.

VI.

The file review conducted by the Department on or about January 5, 2012, also revealed failure of biomonitoring tests for seven (7) day chronic growth and reproduction for <u>Pimephales promeles</u> and <u>Ceriodaphnia dubia</u>. Specifically, failures were noted for outfall TX1Q for every quarterly monitoring period in 2009.

COMPLIANCE ORDER

Based on the foregoing, the Respondent is hereby ordered:

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To immediately take, upon receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, any and all steps necessary to meet and maintain compliance with LPDES permit LA0002844, including but not limited to, collecting representative samples of all parameters, meeting permit effluent limits, and submitting complete and accurate DMRs.

II.

To take, immediately upon receipt of this **COMPLIANCE ORDER**, any and all steps necessary to meet and maintain compliance with the Water Quality Regulations.

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To submit to the Enforcement Division, within thirty (30) days after receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, a written report that includes a detailed description of the circumstances surrounding the cited violation(s) and actions taken or to be taken to achieve compliance with the Order Portion of this COMPLIANCE ORDER. This report and all other reports or information required to be submitted to the Enforcement Division by this COMPLIANCE ORDER shall be submitted to:

The Respondent shall submit each progress report within fifteen (15) days following the end of the calendar quarter. The first progress report is due

July 15, 2015. Additionally, if an activity cannot be completed by the due date specified in the schedule, the Respondent shall submit a certification of non-compliance to the Department within fifteen (15) days after the scheduled due date. If the Respondent reports non-compliance with a scheduled event, the certification shall include a discussion of the cause of the delay, an anticipated date of completion, and a discussion of any impairment of a subsequent due date. Upon completion of all scheduled events, the Respondent shall submit a final certification stating that all activities have been achieved."

The RESPONDENT shall submit to the Enforcement Division, within thirty (30) days after receipt of this AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER, a written report that includes a detailed description of the circumstances surrounding the cited violations added in this AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER and actions taken or to be taken to achieve compliance with the Order Portion of this AMENDED COMPLIANCE ORDER.
