SETTLEMENT

The following Settlement is hereby agreed to between Omega Protein, Inc. (“Respondent”) and the Department of Environmental Quality (“DEQ” or “the Department”), under authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act, La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq. (“the Act”).

I

Respondent is a corporation that owns and/or operates a menhaden fish processing facility located in Cameron, Cameron Parish, Louisiana (“the Facility”).

II

On February 28, 2014, the Department issued to Respondent a Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty (CONOPP), Enforcement No. WE-CN-13-00482, which was based upon the following findings of fact:

“The Respondent owns and/or operates a menhaden fish processing facility located at 391 Gulf Beach Highway, in Cameron, Cameron Parish, Louisiana. The Respondent was issued Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) Permit LA0003654 on January 31, 2005, which became effective on March 1, 2005, and expired on February 28, 2010. The

Respondent submitted a permit renewal application to the Department on or about August 4, 2009. LPDES permit LA0003654 was reissued to the Respondent on May 12, 2010, made effective on June 1, 2010, and will expire on May 31, 2015. Under the terms and conditions of LPDES Permit LA0003654, the Respondent is authorized to discharge process wastewater including boiler blowdown, evaporator condensate, washdown water, barometric leg seal water, bailwater, treated sanitary wastewater, and stormwater runoff to the Calcasieu Ship Channel, all waters of the state.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2013, revealed that the Respondent did cause and/or allow the unauthorized discharge of fish oil to waters of the state. Specifically, on or about August 27, 2009, the menhaden fish processing facility had fish oil tank overflows when a check valve malfunctioned on a lift pump. The quantity of fish oil discharged is unknown. Each unauthorized discharge of fish oil to waters of the state is a violation of La. R.S. 30:2076.A.1.a, and LAC 33:IX.501.D.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2013, revealed that the Respondent did cause and/or allow the unauthorized discharge of fish oil to waters of the state. Specifically, on or about July 14, 2011, the menhaden fish processing facility had fish oil tank overflows when a check valve malfunctioned on a lift pump. The quantity of fish oil discharged was approximately 500 gallons. Each unauthorized discharge of fish oil to waters of the state is a violation of La. R.S. 30:2076.A.1.a, and LAC 33:IX.501.D.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2013, revealed that the Respondent did cause and/or allow the unauthorized discharge of diesel to waters of the state. Specifically, on or about July 21, 2009, a menhaden fish processing fishing vessel collided with a moored fishing vessel while attempting to tie-up. The impact caused a weld failure approximately 20 feet from the stern of the vessel on the starboard side. The split was about 8 inches long adjacent

to one of the diesel fuel tanks. Approximately 120 gallons of diesel were discharged. Each unauthorized discharge of diesel to waters of the state is a violation of La. R.S. 30:2076.A.1.a, and LAC 33:IX.501.D.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2013, and a subsequent file review conducted by the Department on or about November 7, 2013, revealed the following exceedances of permitted discharge limitations as reported by the Respondent on DMRs and non-compliance reports:

Each exceedance of a permitted discharge limitation prior to June 1, 2010, is a violation of LPDES Permit LA0003654 (Part I, Page 3 of 3 and Part III, Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(3), and LAC 33:IX.501.A. Each exceedance of a permitted discharge limitation on or after June 1, 2010, is a violation of LPDES Permit LA0003654 (Limits and Monitoring, Pages 1-4 of 4 and Part III, Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(3), and LAC 33:IX.501.A.”

III

Respondent denies it committed any violations or that it is liable for any fines, forfeitures and/or penalties.

IV

Nonetheless, Respondent, without making any admission of liability under state or federal statute or regulation, agrees to pay, and the Department agrees to accept, a payment in the amount of TWENTY-FOUR THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$24,700.00), of which Four Hundred Fifty and 59/100 Dollars (\$450.59) represents the Department’s enforcement costs, in settlement of the claims set forth in this agreement. The total amount of money expended by Respondent on cash payments to the Department as described above, shall be considered a civil penalty for tax purposes, as required by La. R.S. 30:2050.7(E)(1).

V

Respondent further agrees that the Department may consider the inspection report(s), the

CONOPP and this Settlement for the purpose of determining compliance history in connection with any future enforcement or permitting action by the Department against Respondent, and in any such action Respondent shall be estopped from objecting to the above-referenced documents being considered as proving the violations alleged herein for the sole purpose of determining Respondent's compliance history.

VI

This agreement shall be considered a final order of the Secretary for all purposes, including, but not limited to, enforcement under La. R.S. 30:2025(G)(2), and Respondent hereby waives any right to administrative or judicial review of the terms of this agreement, except such review as may be required for interpretation of this agreement in any action by the Department to enforce this agreement.

VII

This settlement is being made in the interest of settling the state's claims and avoiding for both parties the expense and effort involved in litigation or an adjudicatory hearing. In agreeing to the compromise and settlement, the Department considered the factors for issuing civil penalties set forth in La. R. S. 30:2025(E) of the Act.

VIII

As required by law, the Department has submitted this Settlement Agreement to the Louisiana Attorney General for approval or rejection. The Attorney General's concurrence is appended to this Settlement Agreement.

IX

The Respondent has caused a public notice advertisement to be placed in the official journal of the parish governing authority in Cameron Parish, Louisiana. The advertisement, in form,

wording, and size approved by the Department, announced the availability of this settlement for public view and comment and the opportunity for a public hearing. Respondent has submitted an original proof-of-publication affidavit and an original public notice to the Department and, as of the date this Settlement is executed on behalf of the Department, more than forty-five (45) days have elapsed since publication of the notice.

X

Payment is to be made within ten (10) days from notice of the Secretary's signature. If payment is not received within that time, this Agreement is voidable at the option of the Department. Payments are to be made by check, payable to the Department of Environmental Quality, and mailed or delivered to the attention of Accountant Administrator, Financial Services Division, Department of Environmental Quality, Post Office Box 4303, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70821-4303. Each payment shall be accompanied by a completed Settlement Payment Form (Exhibit A).

XI

In consideration of the above, any claims for penalties are hereby compromised and settled in accordance with the terms of this Settlement.

XII

Each undersigned representative of the parties certifies that he or she is fully authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of his or her respective party, and to legally bind such party to its terms and conditions.


