

What's New for the 2019 Reporting Year

Changes and Notifications

1. No significant changes have been made to ERIC since last reporting period. Some bugs have been resolved and performance issues considered resolved.
2. State IT Data Breach/Ransomware issues can spring up at any time. Check the DEQ website for status updates/outage notices. Notices will not appear when logged into ERIC.

3. Updated AP-42 Sec. 7.1 for Tanks – Per LAC 33:III.919.G, all 2019 inventories are required to use the new method that went into effect November 2019.

4. EPA is reviewing and sending compliance letters based on ERIC data. Please review your permit conditions and ensure your ERIC report is complete and accurate.
 - a. Any piece of equipment with a subject item in TEMPO that has emissions should be in your inventory with the subject item identified.
 - b. Emissions types should be accurate to identify emissions above permit limits as “Unauthorized” or other applicable emission type.
5. Please pay special attention to warnings related to release point exit gas velocity and flow rate greater than 5% of each other. These validation warnings will be **ERRORS** in future years. Please start addressing them now. If there is a programmatic reason that the numbers cannot calculate out properly, please let us know as soon as possible.

1. The due date for the RY2019 Inventory and Certification Statement submittal is Thursday, April 30, 2020.
2. Any requests for coordinate changes or facupdate@la.gov received after 4:00pm on April 30, 2020, will not be processed until the next business day. Any inventories that cannot be submitted on time because of pending facupdate@la.gov and coordinate review/approval issues will be considered late.
