# **SETTLEMENT**

The following Settlement is hereby agreed to between Lakeland Park Sewerage Association ("Respondent") and the Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ" or "the Department"), under authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act, La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq. ("the Act").

I

Respondent is a non-profit corporation that owns and/or operates a sanitary sewage treatment facility located in Baton Rouge, East Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana ("the Facility").

II

On September 24, 2008, the Department issued to Respondent a Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Enforcement No. WE-CN-03-0715 (Exhibit 1).

On May 13, 2009, the Department issued to Respondent a Compliance Order, Enforcement No. WE-C-09-0151 (Exhibit 2).

The following violations, although not cited in the foregoing enforcement action(s), are included within the scope of this settlement:

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about November 16, 2012, and subsequent file reviews conducted by the Department on or about April 5, 2017 and June 22, 2018, revealed the following effluent exceedances as reported by the Respondent on Discharge Monitoring reports (DMRs) and are summarized on Table 1 (see Table 1 attached as Exhibit 3). Each effluent exceedance is in violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (prior to August 22, 2014, Part I, Section B, page 4 of 8, and after August 22, 2014, Part I, Section B, Pages 2 and 3 of 19, and Standard Conditions, section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), and LAC 33:IX.501.A.

III

In response to the Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Respondent made a timely request for a hearing.

IV

Respondent denies it committed any violations or that it is liable for any fines, forfeitures and/or penalties.

V

Nonetheless, Respondent, without making any admission of liability under state or federal statute or regulation, agrees to pay, and the Department agrees to accept, a payment in the amount of SEVENTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$17,500.00), of which Nine Hundred Seventy-Nine and 97/100 Dollars (\$979.97) represents the Department's enforcement costs, in settlement of the claims set forth in this agreement. The total amount of money expended by Respondent on cash payments to the Department as described above, shall be considered a civil penalty for tax purposes, as required by La. R.S. 30:2050.7(E)(1).

VI

Respondent further agrees that the Department may consider the inspection report(s), permit

record(s), the Consolidated Compliance Order & Notice of Potential Penalty, Compliance Order and this Settlement for the purpose of determining compliance history in connection with any future enforcement or permitting action by the Department against Respondent, and in any such action Respondent shall be estopped from objecting to the above-referenced documents being considered as proving the violations alleged herein for the sole purpose of determining Respondent's compliance history.

# VII

This agreement shall be considered a final order of the Secretary for all purposes, including, but not limited to, enforcement under La. R.S. 30:2025(G)(2), and Respondent hereby waives any right to administrative or judicial review of the terms of this agreement, except such review as may be required for interpretation of this agreement in any action by the Department to enforce this agreement.

#### VIII

This settlement is being made in the interest of settling the state's claims and avoiding for both parties the expense and effort involved in litigation or an adjudicatory hearing. In agreeing to the compromise and settlement, the Department considered the factors for issuing civil penalties set forth in La. R. S. 30:2025(E) of the Act.

# IX

As required by law, the Department has submitted this Settlement Agreement to the Louisiana Attorney General for approval or rejection. The Attorney General's concurrence is appended to this Settlement Agreement.

X

The Respondent has caused a public notice advertisement to be placed in the official journal

of the parish governing authority in East Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana. The advertisement, in form and wording approved by the Department, announced the availability of this settlement for public view and comment and the opportunity for a public hearing. Respondent has submitted an original proof-of-publication affidavit and an original public notice to the Department and, as of the date this Settlement is executed on behalf of the Department, more than forty-five (45) days have elapsed since publication of the notice.

XI

Payment is to be made within ten (10) days from notice of the Secretary's signature. If payment is not received within that time, this Agreement is voidable at the option of the Department. Payments are to be made by check, payable to the Department of Environmental Quality, and mailed or delivered to the attention of Accountant Administrator, Financial Services Division, Department of Environmental Quality, Post Office Box 4303, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70821-4303. Each payment shall be accompanied by a completed Settlement Payment Form (Exhibit A).

XII

In consideration of the above, any claims for penalties are hereby compromised and settled in accordance with the terms of this Settlement.

XIII

Each undersigned representative of the parties certifies that he or she is fully authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of his or her respective party, and to legally bind such party to its terms and conditions.

# CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY

The following CONSOLIDATED COMPLIANCE ORDER & NOTICE OF POTENTIAL PENALTY is issued to the LAKELAND PARK SEWERAGE ASSOCIATION (RESPONDENT) by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (the Department), under the authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act (the Act), La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq., and particularly by La. R.S. 30:2025(C), 30:2050.2 and 30:2050.3(B).

## FINDINGS OF FACT

I.

The Respondent owns and/or operates an existing sanitary sewage treatment facility which serves the Lakeland Park Sewerage Association located at 12021 Lakeland Park Blvd., Suite 212, in Baton Rouge, East Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana. The Respondent was granted

coverage under Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) General Permit LAG570000 on December 4, 1997 and was specifically assigned permit number LAG570036. The permit expired on September 30, 2002, and was administratively extended. The Respondent submitted a permit renewal application on July 2, 2004. LPDES permit LAG570036 was reissued to the Respondent on or about July 11, 2005, and will expire on March 14, 2009. Under the terms and conditions of the LPDES permit, the Respondent is authorized to discharge treated sanitary wastewater from Outfall 001 into an unnamed ditch, thence into Clay Cut Bayou, thence into the Amite River, all waters of the state.

II.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2001, revealed that the Respondent had operation and maintenance deficiencies. Specifically, there were no chlorine tablets in the chlorine contact chamber; the weirs had excessive growth obstructing flow; there were solids present on the ground around the base of the plant; and the effluent was gray/brown in color with a slight odor. Vegetation growth was also observed in the weirs during an inspection conducted by the Department on or about January 28, 2003. The failure to properly operate and maintain the facility constitutes a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part III, Sections A.2 and B.3.a), La. R. S. 30:2076 (A) (3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.2701.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.E.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2001, revealed that the Respondent failed to follow approved test methods. Specifically, the pH holding times were being exceeded. Each failure to utilize approved test methods constitutes a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part I, Section C.1, Part III, Sections A.2 and C.5), La. R. S. 30:2076 (A) (3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.2701.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.J.4.

IV.

An inspection conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2001, and a subsequent file review conducted by the Department on or about April 10, 2008, revealed that the Respondent failed to submit Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs) as required by the permit. Specifically, the Respondent failed to submit DMRs for the following monitoring period: January, July, August and September of 2001; January through June, and October through December of 2003; January through September of 2004; and January through September of 2005. Each failure to submit DMRs is a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part I, Section C, and Part III, Sections A.2 and D.4), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A) (3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.2701.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.L.4.a.

V.,

Inspections conducted by the Department on or about February 28, 2001, and on January 28, 2003, and a subsequent file review conducted by the Department on or about April 10, 2008, revealed the Respondent exceeded effluent limitations. These effluent exceedances, as reported by the Respondent on Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs), are summarized below:

Each effluent excursion constitutes a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part I, Section B and Part III Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(1), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.501.D, and LAC 33:IX.2701.A. Each failure to submit a noncompliance report is a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part III, Sections A.2 and D.7), La R.S. 30:2076(A)(3), La R.S. 30:2076(D), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.2701.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.L.7.

# COMPLIANCE ORDER

Based on the foregoing, the Respondent is hereby ordered:

I.

To immediately take, upon receipt of this **COMPLIANCE ORDER**, any and all steps necessary to meet and maintain compliance with LPDES permit LAG570036, including but not limited to, submitting non-compliance reports for permit exceedances, utilizing approved test methods, submitting DMRs and properly operating and maintaining the facility.

II.

In the event the respondent believes that complete correction is not physically possible within thirty (30) days, the Respondent shall submit, within thirty (30) days after receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, a comprehensive plan for the expeditious elimination and prevention of such noncomplying discharges. Such plan shall provide for specific corrective actions to be taken and shall include a critical path schedule for the achievement of compliance within the shortest time possible.

III.

To submit to the Enforcement Division, within thirty (30) days after receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, properly completed Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs) for the monitoring period of January through October of 2005. If you are submitting copies of DMRs,

please be advised that each copy of the DMR shall be signed and dated with an original signature. If no sampling or monitoring was conducted during a monitoring period, the Respondent should indicate this in the space provided for "Comment and Explanation of Any Violations."

IV.

To submit to the Enforcement Division, within thirty (30) days after receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, a written report that includes a detailed description of the circumstances surrounding the cited violations and actions taken or to be taken to achieve compliance with the Order Portion of this COMPLIANCE ORDER. This report and all other reports or information required to be submitted to the Enforcement Division by this COMPLIANCE ORDER shall be submitted to:

# **COMPLIANCE ORDER**

The following COMPLIANCE ORDER is issued to the LAKELAND PARK SEWERAGE ASSOCIATION by the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (the Department), under the authority granted by the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act (the Act), La. R.S. 30:2001, et seq., and particularly by La. R.S. 30:2025(C), 30:2050.2 and 30:2050.3(B).

## FINDINGS OF FACT

I.

The Respondent owns and/or operates an existing sanitary sewage treatment facility which serves the Lakeland Park Sewerage Association located at 12021 Lakeland Park Blvd., in Baton Rouge, East Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana. The Respondent was granted coverage under Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) General Permit LAG570000 on December 4, 1997 and was specifically assigned permit number LAG570036. The permit expired on September 30, 2002, and was administratively extended. The Respondent submitted a permit renewal application on July 2, 2004. LPDES permit LAG570036 was reissued to the Respondent on or about July 11, 2005. LPDES permit expired on March 14, 2009. The Respondent did not submit a Notice of Intent (NOI) as required by LPDES permit LAG570036. The Respondent does not have a Louisiana Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (LPDES)

permit or any other authority to discharge wastewater and/or other substances to waters of the state. The discharge of treated sanitary wastewater from Outfall 001 is into an unnamed ditch, thence into Clay Cut Bayou, thence into the Amite River, all waters of the state.

H

A file review conducted by the Department on or about May 8, 2009, revealed that the Respondent was operating without an LPDES permit from March 14, 2009, the date the LPDES permit LAG570036 expired, until present. The unauthorized discharge of wastewater from March 14, 2009, until present is a violation of La. R.S. 30:2075, La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(1)(a), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.501.D, and LAC 33:IX.2311.A.1.

III.

A file review conducted by the Department on or about May 8, 2009, revealed that the Respondent failed to apply for a permit. The failure to apply for a permit is a violation of La. R.S. 30:2076 (A) (1), LAC 33:IX.501.A, and LAC 33:IX.2331.A.1.

Each effluent excursion constitutes a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part I, Section B and Part III Section A.2), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(1), La. R.S. 30:2076(A)(3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.501.D, and LAC 33:IX.2701.A.

V.

A file review conducted on or about May 8, 2009, revealed that the Respondent failed to submit a Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) for the monitoring period of June 2008. Each failure to submit DMRs is a violation of LPDES permit LAG570036 (Part II, Section N.7, and Part III, Sections A.2 and D.4), La. R.S. 30:2076 (A) (3), LAC 33:IX.501.A, LAC 33:IX.2701.A, and LAC 33:IX.2701.L.4.a.

## COMPLIANCE ORDER

Based on the foregoing, the Respondent is hereby ordered:

To immediately cease, upon receipt of this COMPLIANCE ORDER, any unauthorized discharges from the Respondent's facility to waters of the state and to take any and all steps necessary to meet and maintain compliance with the Water Quality Regulations.
