**LDEQ to host webinar: Louisiana's Approach to the TMDL Program**

**BATON ROUGE** – The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality’s (LDEQ) EnviroSchool will hold a live webinar discussing Louisiana’s Approach to the Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Program.

This session will provide information about strategic approaches to stream restoration and protection, including changes to Louisiana’s TMDL Program. A TMDL is a pollution budget for a specific waterbody. It is the maximum amount of a pollutants that can be released into a waterbody without causing the waterbody to become impaired and/or to violate state water quality standards. TMDLs and associated activities effectively implemented should lead to improvements in water quality.
